<p>Overall, the discussions during the first event underscored the significance of common values and shared goals in fostering cohesion, collaboration, and progress within any community or organization. Through ongoing dialogue and collective action, participants aimed to harness these principles to drive positive change and achieve their collective aspirations.</p> <p>The objectives of this meeting were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - To analyze the links between ecological and green transition and security and peace in Europe - To plant a “tree for peace” <p>On the 22nd of April, during an informal dinner, we had the distinct pleasure of meeting with all the participants of this significant gathering. This convivial introduction set the stage for the forthcoming collaborative engagements.</p> <p>On the 23rd of April, a momentous occasion heralded the inception of collaborative efforts among the Green Youth partners at the Ibis Polithenica Hotel. Spearheaded by Asociatia Se Poate, the sixth work package event symbolized a continuous transformative journey. The primary agenda for the day was a conference led by experts from ECONOS Consulting, a firm specializing in sustainability services for corporations. The presentation was both stimulating and enlightening, focusing on the theme of energy autonomy as a pivotal element in the European Geopolitical Strategy to ensure peace and achieve climate neutrality within the EU.</p> <p>Adhering to the structured agenda, the day afforded us an invaluable opportunity through the cinema forum. This segment provided an intriguing overview of mini-documentaries centered on sustainability, peace, and democracy. Following this, a pivotal session of open debate ensued, wherein participants discussed the necessity of achieving energy self-sufficiency and the defossilization of energy production to meet climate goals. This discourse was also framed as a strategic approach to fostering peace and democracy. It was a compelling opportunity to examine our diverse perspectives, understand the different values, cultures, and countries represented, and to identify commonalities and potential solutions to these pressing issues.</p> <p>The afternoon session featured an enlightening Photographic Tour. Participants explored more of Bucharest, including a visit to the renowned Grigore Antipa National Museum of Natural History. This excursion allowed us to observe a variety of animal species, some extant and others extinct due to ecosystem disturbances, primarily environmental problems. This direct observation underscored the profound impact of human actions on ecosystems and their inhabitants.</p> <p>The day's final session was a workshop involving local students from Bucharest, who collaborated with project participants. Utilizing the World Café method, this session yielded fascinating insights into the intersections between green transition, peace, and democracy in Europe.</p> <p>The second day of activities commenced with an engaging session titled "Plant a Tree for Peace." Participants visited a municipal planting site, where they planted trees as a symbolic act advocating for peace in Europe, the defense of human rights, and the maintenance of international order.</p> <p>In essence, the inaugural event served as a beacon of collective endeavor, epitomizing the transformative potential of collaboration guided by shared values and aspirations. Through ongoing dialogue and concerted action, the Green Youth partners embarked on a trajectory poised to effect positive change, transcending boundaries and catalyzing inclusive growth and progress.</p>
